

Alberta Curriculum Documents

In addition to the core and complementary *Programs of Study*, which identify what Alberta students are expected to learn and do in all subjects and grades, the Doucette collection contains curriculum guides, implementation manuals, assessment materials and other support documents produced by Alberta Education. Most of these are on the circulating shelves but a few policy documents can be found in reference.

Textbooks

We have both circulating and 'library use only' copies of all the textbooks authorized for use in K – 12 Alberta schools. Borrowing of these texts is restricted to students currently registered in the Faculty of Education, or to other cardholders who are active ATA members and have proof that they are currently teaching in the Calgary area.

Alberta Education's term for what we normally call a 'textbook' is a "basic student resource. Although you can use this term to search the library catalogue, you would be better advised to find out the titles of CURRENTLY authorized texts from Alberta Education's [Authorized Resources database](#) and then search our catalogue for the titles you want.

The Authorized Resources Database also provides lists of other teaching and student support materials recommended by Alberta Education.
