

Periodicals

The Doucette Library acquires print copies of periodicals that are used by practicing teachers, either to stay aware of issues in the field (e.g. *Educational Leadership*) or because they provide ideas about how to teach specific subjects (e.g. *Reading Teacher*). We also subscribe to most journals published by the specialist councils of the Alberta Teachers Association.

Individual **back issues** of periodicals can be borrowed. They are shelved in alphabetical order by title along the west wall of the library. The most **current issues** of periodicals do not circulate but can be used in the library. They are found on the periodical display shelf across from the south windows.

There is a small collection of **French language** periodicals housed with the French language collection

Online Access for Periodicals

Education students have access to a substantial number of electronic full text journals through the hundreds of online databases to which the University Library subscribes.

The most extensive educational database is **ERIC**. It indexes both journal articles and ERIC Documents*: books, theses, curricula, conference papers, and standards and guidelines from a multitude of sources and across all educational topics.
