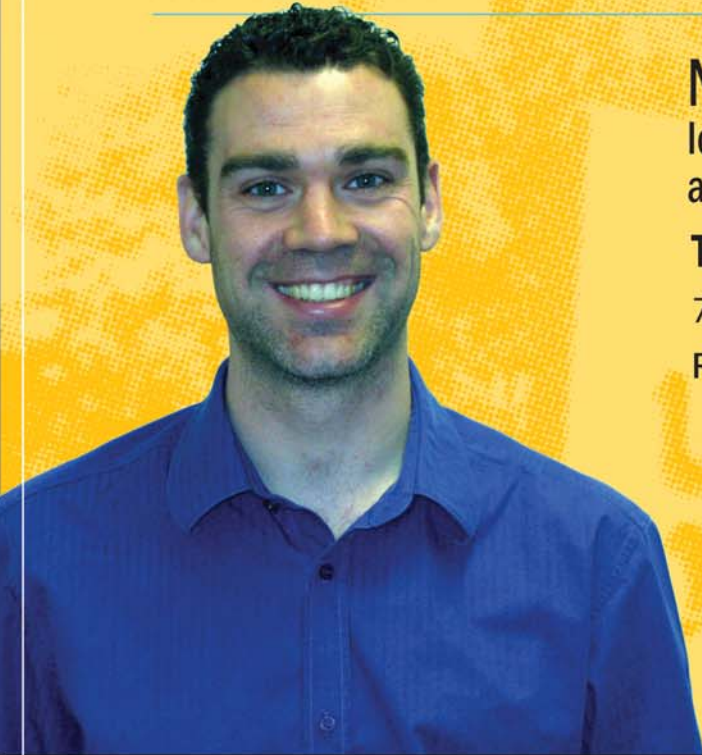

Changing Education for a Changing World

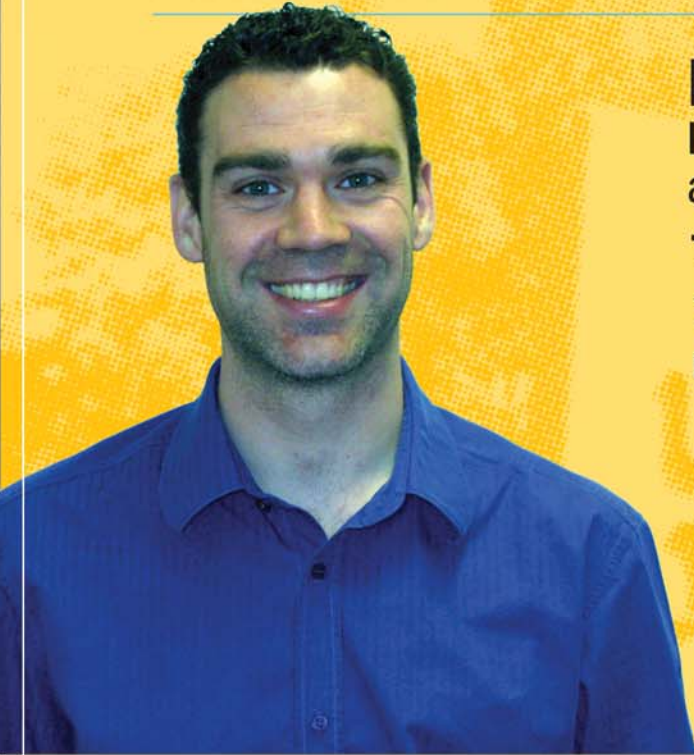
Do you or someone you care about have Asperger syndrome? Have you ever felt that the common perception and information about Asperger syndrome doesn't quite fit with your experience? Much of the research and information pertaining to Asperger syndrome has been negative, focusing on weaknesses or deficits. Our understanding of the skills and abilities of individuals with Asperger syndrome is expanding, and new research has shed light on some positive areas of ability that have been overlooked in the past. As part of National Autism Awareness month, Dr. Adam McCrimmon will discuss current perspectives on Asperger syndrome to help you better understand how their skills can be used to foster resilience and positive growth.

Dr. Adam McCrimmon is a registered psychologist and assistant professor in Educational Studies in Psychology in the Faculty of Education at the University of Calgary. He has 15 years experience working with children, youth, and adults with Autism and Asperger syndrome.
